## Choosing a Group

- 3. Do you have complementary skills and assets? Writing? Art? Word processing/computer skills? Telephone? Parents willing to transport to libraries and/or interviews? Acting? Speaking voice?
- 4. Is each of your partners reliable? Do you know how to reach them by phone? Do they have regular school attendance? In advanced competition all group members must be present for judging.
- Do your parents know each other? (This is especially helpful for transportation and weekend work sessions.)
- 6. Be very careful when choosing to work with friends. Make sure you can work well together. Many friendships have ended during a History Fair project. Partners should have similar work habits and goals.
